CORPORATE PRAYER

Heavenly Father

Thank You that You have provided all that is necessary for us to know You and to flourish spiritually as we walk in step with You.

Thank You for leaving us the Power of the Holy Spirit that helps us in our weaknesses to witness to our friends, family and social contacts; to worship You freely and to walk in a way that honours You. Please help us Father, to open our lives up to Your Spirit that we may increasingly know His presence and power in all that we think, say and do. Help us not to quench Him by resisting His direction, or to grieve Him by acting out of our own self-reliance.

Father, thank You for leaving us Your Word. Help us to treasure it, not simply to have it as a badge of honour that we bring to church, or on our bookshelves to look spiritual to our visitors. Let it be well used, read often, searched for its treasure, memorised and consulted for life’s decisions. Help us to give as much time to watching what it has to say, as we spend watching and indulging far less important or upright sources such as the TV or the Internet.

Father, thank You for leaving us brothers and sisters that remind us we are part of a larger family, and that can encourage us and instruct us. Please help us Lord to be contributors to that family, not constant takers. Help us to take the initiative in encouraging others and being kind to each other. Help us to think well of others, not assume the worst of them; and also to think before we say things that will tear down rather than build up.

We have not yet discovered all there is to know of You Lord, neither have we done all You have for us to do on this earth. We are hungry for more of You and humbly ask that You would empower us afresh and work in us and through us that we may become more like You and help others to know You too.

POINTS TO PONDER

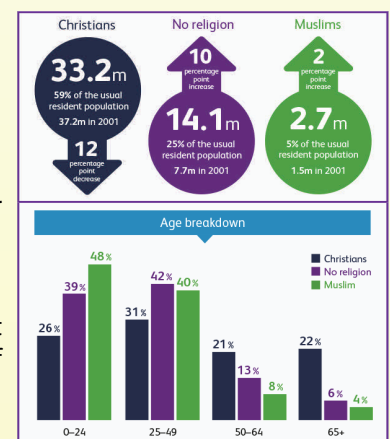
Faith in Britain (source – Office of National Statistics: Census 2011)

- **33.2m people** in UK consider themselves **Christian (down 12% since 2001)**
- **14.1m people** in UK consider themselves to have **no faith (up 10%)** + another **7.2m people** in UK did not answer the census question!
- **2.7m people** in UK consider themselves **Muslim (up 2%)**
- **Age breakdown** - see graphic opposite. This is a serious cause for concern. Whilst 57% of Christians are under the age of 50, 81% of those with no faith and 88% of those professing to be Muslim are in this age bracket.

We need to do more to share the Gospel with those under 50!

The Church in Britain (source – Dr Peter Brierley in conjunction with Christian Research publication “UK Church Statistics, 2005-2015 “)

- In 2010 there were **2.9 million churchgoers** - down from **3.5 million in 2000**. If present trends continue, church attendance in Britain is predicted to fall to **2.6 million by 2015** and **2.3 million by 2020**
- There are **50,700 churches or congregations** in the UK today (**up 2% since 2005**) = that equates to an average of **57 per congregation**
- There are **340 Christian denominations** in the UK (**up by 65 in 2006**) with **36,600 ministers (up 4% since 2005)**
- **Church membership** equates to **11% of the population (down 6% since 2005)**

Reading the Bible (source – Confidence in the Word website based on research undertaken by the Bible Society)

- **16% of REGULAR CHURCHGOERS** read their Bible **every day**
- **9%** read the Bible **several times a week**; **11%** at least **once a week** and **9%** **once a month**
- **14%** have not read their Bible in the **last year** and **18%** have **never read the Bible ever in their lives**

The challenge to see spiritual renewal in our county and nation may seem great but lets remember

As we pray and as we work together in unity spiritual transformation will occur!
